2019 Contest Guidelines/Q&As



What is this?

The Fremont Area Community Foundation's Youth Philanthropy Contest is an exciting opportunity for youth to use their creativity, compassion, and talent to make a difference in their community. The Fremont Area Community Foundation wants kids from kindergarten through grade 12 to ask themselves this question:

"How can I make a difference in my community?"

Applicants can submit their best ideas to change the world, right here in their own backyards. **Contest winners** will receive up to \$1,000 to implement their projects.

What does it mean to "make a difference?"

We are looking for projects that help our community grow and change for the better and are "philanthropic" in nature. *Philanthropy* is a big word but it can be easily understood as "giving of your time, talents, and treasure for the benefit of all." Here are some questions to help you think about ways to make things better in your community:

What do I care about? How can my caring help others? What in my community needs fixing? What would make my community a better place?

Your idea could be something you've been thinking about for a while or a totally random spark of inspiration – as long as it benefits others. You could save something, create something, or change something. Tell us about your best idea for making a difference!

We're looking for project ideas that:

- Have a positive impact on the community
- Can be completed within 9 months
- Take place in the FACF grant area (see map)
- Are charitable in nature (which means it must focus on serving the public interest or common good)
- Engage young people in philanthropy

Do I have to do this by myself?

Not unless you want to! You can do a project on your own, with friends, or

as part of a class, club or group. Project funding will be determined by the project budget and may be as much as \$1,000. In addition, there will be a "best of show" project chosen also!



How do I complete an application?

There are a few things that **MUST** be turned in with your application including forms and additional pieces that may help "sell" your idea to the selection committee to give them a better sense of what you are trying to

accomplish. The more you can demonstrate the details of your project and its impact in the community, the better your chances of being selected.

Required Application Materials:

- Contest Application (all sections must be completed including a media release for EACH student that participates in your group.)
- Examples or prototypes of your project if it is a product of some kind
- Project Display (Posters, photos, display boards, sketches, flow charts, impact statements, statistics, or anything else that helps showcase your project) and/or video (on YouTube or flash drive)

Optional Things to Submit to the Foundation:

• Pre-application submission form (deadline: October 9)

You are HIGHLY encouraged to create some sort of visuals to go with

your written application. It has been our experience that the projects that included good displays with their application submissions are more likely to be chosen as contest winners. Videos do not have to be long or especially polished—just engaging and effective at telling your story!

What is the deadline for this contest and what do I do with my contest materials when they are done? Contest applications and materials can be mailed to or dropped off at the Fremont Area Community Foundation,

Written applications: are due by October 18, 2019. No late entries will be accepted.

Supporting materials: Project displays, prototypes, etc. can be brought to the YPC Contest presentations on (date) (see next paragraph).

All applicants will be required to present their projects to the selection committee on November 4th beginning at 4:00 pm at the First State Bank Education Center (1005 E 23rd St, Fremont). Once we have received your written application, you will be contacted to set up a time for your presentation. All applicants (or their representatives) with qualifying proposals are required to attend the presentations.

When do you announce the winners?

Winners will be notified by mail in **November 2019**, following the applicant presentations on November 4th.

OTHER FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How will I know if you received my application?

We will send a confirmation email to the address you provide on your application.

Is there a way I can get help with my application?

You can always get help by calling 402-721-4252 or email us at info@facfoundation.org with any questions you might have about the contest or application process.

Why should I submit a video, poster or other visual aid?

Visual aids such as videos, posters, or displays help our selection committee better understand your project and the impact that it can have on the community. Use the visuals to sell your idea and tell us why it should be selected for funding. It has been our experience that the projects that included detailed visual aids with their application submissions are more likely to be chosen as contest winners.

Are there any guidelines for my video?

Your video must be **2** minutes or less in length, be appropriate to your project, be in English, and be clear, focused and audible. You must also have the permission of all identifiable individuals (or a parent or guardian if he/she is 17 years of age or younger) in your video. Videos can be placed on youtube.com (please include the link in your application) or submitted on a portable flash drive.

Do I have to make sure my project is approved by the community organization or group that it benefits?

YES! All projects that directly impact a club, group, or organization MUST have approval from those organizations affected by the project for your application to be considered for the contest. Not having permission to move forward with your project should it be selected as a contest winner will disqualify your application. *Please note, however, that we would be happy to help you identify and connect with the organization most likely to be impacted by your project idea. Just give us a call or email.*

Who decides which projects receive funding?

The Youth Philanthropy Contest has a selection committee that will be reviewing all applications.

What happens if my idea is funded?

If your idea is selected for funding, you will be connected to either a non-profit agency or a local service club which will serve as your mentor and help you complete your project and obtain reimbursement for expenditures. The prize money will be granted to the 501(c)(3) organization, not to the individual contest winner.

If you are a contest winner, you will complete an agreement form regarding the implementation of your project, timelines and the reporting guidelines.

Must I report back to the Fremont Area Community Foundation after completing my project?

You and your mentor will provide updates to the Fremont Area Community Foundation on your project's progress. When your project is completed, we will ask you to answer a few questions about your project and how it went.

What is the timeline for completing my project?

You have nine months to complete your project from the date you receive your funding.

What do I do with my contest application and display once they are done?

Contest applications and materials can be mailed to or dropped off at the Fremont Area Community Foundation, Attn: Youth Philanthropy Contest, 1005 E. 23rd Street, Suite #2, Fremont, NE 68025. Written applications are due by **October 18, 2019**. No late entries will be accepted.

All applicants will be required to present their projects to the selection committee on **November 4th** beginning at 4:00 pm at the First State Bank Education Center (1005 E 23rd St, Fremont). Once we have received your application, you will be contacted to set up a time for your presentation.

Supporting materials: You may bring your project displays, prototypes, etc. with you on November 4th, OR you you may drop them off at the FACF office any time the week of October 28th, and the FACF staff will set it up for your presentation. We suggest sending video/media links, presentation files, etc. in advance to lfeadactoundation.org so they can be pre-loaded if possible.
