Arlington Public Schools Project: CPR Training for Students Total Project Cost: \$4,449 for the first year Amount Requested: \$1,500 Amount Awarded: \$1,500

Arlington Public Schools has realigned its health curriculum to national standards which emphasize teaching first aid and safety. Plans are to teach and certify 9<sup>th</sup> grade students in infant, child and adult CPR as established by the American Heart Association. The district has purchased one set of CPR mannequins and is in need of two more to provide hands-on training and assessment to students in a timely manner. CPR training will be provided by the school nurse and an additional nurse, who are certified through the American Heart Association.

## Rebuilding Together, Greater Fremont Area, Inc.

Project: North Bend Branch Office Expansion Total Project Cost: \$28,431 Amount Requested: \$15,000 Amount Awarded: \$5,000

Rebuilding Together-Greater Fremont Area is opening a branch office in North Bend in an effort to assist low-income, elderly and disabled individuals, families, veterans and families with young children maintain safe and healthy homes. With a dramatic increase in qualified applicants requesting assistance in Fremont, it is becoming increasingly difficult for the organization to acquire the resources necessary to assist homeowners in surrounding communities. The organization's goal for opening the North Bend office is to build partnerships with volunteers and benefactors in the surrounding communities by creating a community presence in the North Bend area so that Rebuilding Together can continue to serve homeowners in those communities.

# **Friends of the Pathfinder Hotel**

Project: Pathfinder Hotel Monument Total Project Cost: \$33,000 Amount Requested: \$5,000 Amount Awarded: \$5,000

The Friends of the Pathfinder Hotel is a group working to erect a monument to recognize the significance of the Pathfinder Hotel in Fremont's history. This permanent memorial will be located in the City of Fremont Park across the street from the hotel site. It will memorialize the 20 lives lost and the more than 90 injured in the explosion that destroyed the hotel nearly 40 years ago. A dedication is planned during a ceremony around the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the explosion.

#### **Digg Site Productions**

Project: Our Town: Fremont Total Project Cost: \$37,200 Amount Requested: \$31,000

Funding will help create a professional update of the 1970s "Fremont: The Founding" documentary, reimagining and expanding upon the existing documentary film. Digg Site anticipates this project will help place Fremont within the greater historical landscape of our region which includes growth of the railroads and agricultural industry. The new film will include profiles of the people who built Fremont and interviews with those alive today who have unique perspectives on our community's history.

Twin Rivers YMCA Project: 2015 Freedom Run Total Project Cost: \$17,400 Amount Requested: \$5,000

The 5<sup>th</sup> annual Freedom Run is a USA Track & Fieldcertified race commemorating 9/11 hosted by the Twin Rivers YMCA in Valley, NE. The purpose of the run is to raise funds and awareness for healthy living through YMCA programs, and promote health and fitness in Dodge, Saunders, and Western Douglas Counties. The race, which will be held on **September 13<sup>th</sup>, 2015**, includes a 21-gun salute, a large American flag flying over the finish line and the singing of the National Anthem, all of which promote civic pride and patriotism.

#### **American Heart Association**

Project: Mission: Lifeline – Rural Nebraska Total Project Cost: \$5,290,673 Amount Requested: \$49,999 Amount Awarded: \$49,999 (through a joint funding partnership with the Fremont Health Foundation)

A person experiencing a STEMI (the deadliest type of heart attack) has less than 90 minutes to receive treatment or the person is likely to have significant heart damage, go into full cardiac arrest, or die. A 12lead ECG machine is the only portable equipment that EMS members can use to determine if a person is experiencing a STEMI and needs a hospital with a cardiac catheterization lab. Funding will support 12lead ECG equipment for EMS agencies within the City of Fremont, Hooper, Scribner and North Bend.

# **Girl Scouts Spirit of Nebraska**

Project: Camp Crossed Arrows Summer Programming Total Project Cost: \$36,586 Amount Requested: \$2,500

The goal of Camp Crossed Arrows Summer Programming is to provide the Girl Scout Leadership Experience through trained volunteers and the resources of the natural surroundings to contribute to each camper's mental, physical, social and spiritual development and well-being.

## **Fremont Family YMCA**

Project: Sid and Hazel Dillon Family Aquatic CenterTotal Project Cost: \$1,450,000Amount Requested: \$100,000Amount Awarded: \$100,000

The Fremont Family YMCA is seeking funds to help construct the Sid and Hazel Dillon Aquatic Center. This indoor natatorium will include an 8-lane competition pool with seating for 300 spectators, a family area and new locker rooms. The competition pool will be used by competitive swim teams, lap swimmers and diving teams as well as those taking swimming lessons or enjoying open swim time. The family area will feature a zero-depth entry pool with interactive water features, a resistance walking/lazy river, and a space for swim lessons and water fitness classes.
